

26 March 2025, The three-day Sewa Sarathi training class was inaugurated by Gurusharan Prasad, trustee of Rashtriya Sewa Bharati, under the aegis of Sewa Bharati, Jharkhand by lighting the lamp. This training class has been organized at Sewa Dham located in Gudidih village of Jonha under Angada block. In this class, 130 women workers from different districts of Jharkhand are taking training. In the three-day training class, along with the development of the quality of the worker, training will be given by expert trainers on important subjects like technology of working online, self-reliance, self-employment, rural entrepreneurship training, information about the public welfare schemes of the government etc. Addressing the inaugural program, Gurusharan Prasad said that "On the occasion of the centenary year of Rashtriya Swayamsewak Sangh, the aim is to take the service work of Sewa Bharati to all the blocks, panchayats and service colonies of Jharkhand. Sewa Sarathi will play an important role in this expansion work." In the inaugural session, Gurusharan Prasad told that self-help groups are being run by the government and other institutions in the society, Sewa Bharti has named the self-help group as Vaibhavshree. "Vaibhav" means wealth, "Shri" means "Lakshmi". Sewa Bharti is working on three subjects of service, culture and harmony among women through the Vaibhavshree dimension. Only through service, culture and harmony, a beautiful environment will be created in the entire society and the country will develop in all aspects.

In today's training class, training was given on the subject of time planning. On the occasion, technical skills like flour mill, rice mill, method of extracting oil, wet lentils, masala grinding technique, making paper donas, plates by machine etc. were taught regarding self-employment and entrepreneurship training. Along with this, interesting sports and yogasanas were taught. Class teachers Sanjay Goyal, Laxman Patra, Mahendra ji and other activists played an important role in conducting the training class.

On the occasion of "All India Women's Day" and the 128th death anniversary of India's first female teacher and social reformer, Savitribai Phule, "Sewa Bharti Indore" organized programs at 40 places in urban service colonies*

In these programs, Savitribai Phule's personality was introduced and her contribution to the society was remembered. Savitribai Phule did important work for the education of women and underprivileged classes, which is still a source of inspiration for the society. Invited speakers in the programs highlighted the struggle-filled life of Savitribai Phule and the educational institutions established by her in front of the women power who came from the colonies. About 1417 girls and women participated in these programs and took a pledge to move forward in the field of education inspired by her ideals. Many girls came in the costume of Savitribai Phule.

These events of Sewa Bharti emphasized the importance of education in the society and the empowerment of women. Savitribai Phule's thoughts and work are still guiding for social reform and women empowerment.





The one who wrote a new saga of service: **Narendra Bhai Panchasara**

There is a sun in the whole universe whose infinite rays fill countless homes with light. Just like Narendra Kaka of Gujarat, whose personality and flow of thoughts are still

filling countless bodies and minds with the energy of patriotism. Born in Amreli, Gujarat, Panchasara ji started his life as a preacher from the rural areas of Panchmahal district. When his centre became Surat in 1977, by then he had understood the goal of his life. And that was the overall development of the tribal area of South Gujarat. Then what, like Arjun, he made a big plan to hit his goal. To eradicate many problems in the tribal society like illiteracy, drug addiction, religious conversion, unemployment, poverty, vanishing organic farming, he established Dr. Ambedkar Vanvasi Kalyan Trust in Surat in 1999.

Age does not come in the way of those who have high spirits. After completing 66 years of his life, Narendra Kaka boarded the chariot of Kalyan Roopi Trust and paved the way for the Bhagirathi of development in about 270 villages of Dang and Tapi districts near Surat. Thousands of families benefited from this continuous Ganga of service till the evening of his life i.e. for 18 years.

Shri Narendra Bhai Girdharlal Panchasara, who was born in 1933 in Amreli, Gujarat, lost his mother at the age of 4. His father Shri Girdharlal Panchasara played the role of both mother and father for all the children with full devotion. The then provincial pracharak, Hon. Laxmanrao Inamdar ji brought Narendra to the branch and Panchasara ji received his guidance throughout his life. Service-minded Narendra Kaka had made up his mind since childhood that he would make himself capable of serving the nation. After studying in Amreli, he gave the artist inside him a chance to earn some money in Indore, but since his mind was completely dedicated to the service of the nation, at the age of 25, he left Godhra as a preacher.

Bhupendra Bhai, a full-time worker who worked with Narendrabhai for a long time, tells that Dr. Ambedkar Banvasi Kalyan Trust has not only made more than 1600 women capable and self-reliant by forming 130 Sakhi Mandals in Dang and Tapi districts, but has also awakened the spirit of leadership in them. To increase the income of farmers in 250 villages, the Trust taught them to do organic farming and produce improved seeds themselves. In the year 2006, the service-minded workers of the Trust started the work of village development in Gatari village of Songarh tehsil in Tapi district, effective demonstrations were made by

preparing farmers for modern agriculture, seed production, construction of Boribandh for water conservation, making Desi Khatar (manure) and Jeevamrit. Efforts of the workers and guidance of Narendra Kaka made Gatadi an ideal village in 14 years. Kisan Melas were also started to ensure that farmers get a fair price for their crops. In 2003, a hostel was started in a rented house in Ahwa village through Sewa dham and in 2005, a hostel was established in Sewadham's own building for students of underprivileged classe

Working under the guidance of Narendra Kaka for many years, Shri Mithalal ji Jain, who was the Sangh Chalak of West Surat at that time, tells that once when an earthquake struck Kutch, the workers worked hard all day and prepared 15-day packets of food grains to distribute in the trust. The next day, some packets were found missing in those packets. Seeing this, the workers remembered that there was construction going on nearby and labourers were working there. Those labourers must have stolen some of these packets. They told this to Narendra Kaka. Narendra Kaka told them that all of you should take one packet each and give it to their homes. Everyone was shocked that they had stolen and then you are giving them packets. Then Kaka said that they had to steal the grains. This is our weakness whereas it was the responsibility of the society to feed them. On getting the food packets again, the labourers themselves realized their mistake.s from 9th to 12th.

He used to worry about every person living in his proximity. Chaudhary Chacha, who was his charioteer for a long time, tells that both his children had problems in speaking, so Narendra Kaka gave the responsibility of singing songs and praying in the branch to both the children and the result was that in one year, both the children's stammering and throat disease were cured. He knew very well how to use whom and when to use in the interest of the society. Piyush Mehta, currently the trustee of Ambedkar Bhawan, tells that in 2005 Narendra Kaka asked him when he was retiring. On hearing 30 November as the answer from Piyush Bhai, he told him to come to the office from 1 December as the work has been fixed for him. Piyush has been handling his responsibilities since 2007 till date. This incident is of 2005, i.e. he had made plans for the next 2 years as well. Piyush Bhai tells that Narendra Kaka had the ability to judge a worker, he could recognize the worker's ability and his qualities and understand what work to give him. Some people stay here even after leaving this world. The good deeds of Narendra Bhai Panchasara are still echoing among the people of Gujarat. His love and affection made him Narendra Kaka for the people.



ANSARWADA

Ghumantu Samaj standing on its own feet

Bhatke Vimukt Vikas Parishad, Latur

Devgiri Prant

This story is about a unique village. The name is Ansarwada. This village is located in the Latur district of Maharashtra. There is a plateau near the village, some nomadic castes live on that plateau; It is said by Madariddha that these people associate themselves with Shri Krishna and call themselves Gopal, that is, the people of Gopal Samaj. Due to the activism of some volunteers of Gayadya Sangh and some people of Gopal Samaj, a plan was made for the upliftment of these people. An organization named Gaya Bhatke Vimukt Vikas Parishad was formed for the development of the village and it was registered as Govind Maharaj Gopal Samaj Vikas Parishad.

Most of the families in the township make jhuggi jhopdi or pal; They used to sew torn old clothes and lived in a tent-like house. Due to the work of the council, winds of change started blowing in the lives of the people of Gopal Samaj of Ansarbada. Mr. Hiten ji, a businessman from Mumbai, spoke further and took the responsibility of the development of the township. Pledged to build 100 pucca houses and hand over them. Temple and school along with other employment oriented schemes were started in this colony. Mr. Hiten ji says that all these people who have gone astray due to some reason are my own and it is my responsibility to work for its upliftment. is included

Like Ansar Bara, permanent houses and employment have been provided to the nomadic families in nearby settlements of Latur district in the government schemes, but by staying at one place in the Gumantu society, the desire to live a respectable life in the main stream of the society has arisen. Now, along with electricity and pure drinking water connections, Aadhaar, Voter ID cards, health cards, ration cards, and labor cards are also available in their homes. Family junk elders have started getting pension.

Along with respectable identity in the society, work has been started to ensure that they have their own identity in the government as well.

On the recommendation of the 'Dada Idade Committee' established by the Government of Maharashtra, the Gopal

society was included in the nomadic societies, but efforts are on to provide facilities for jobs and admission in educational institutions, and all the necessary documents of all the family members have been prepared. In Ansarbada, the Council started a primary school, along with other important works, skill and industry training was arranged to make this society self-sufficient.

After training in handicrafts, both men and women were assisted in making products; pearl beads, chessboards, pedestals, decorative items and jhali bags etc. were made at the center; its handicraft items were appreciated in the nearby fairs and markets; The income of the savings group started increasing by giving training in the Basti; Self-help groups have been formed; savings have been encouraged; bank accounts have been opened;

The business of band playing is also going on very well. Some people have even bought jeeps by taking loan from the bank. At present, the most educated boy of Gopal Samaj is eighth grade pass and the special thing is that his further education is going on.

Ansarbara's band playing is very famous in all the surrounding areas. Be it every auspicious festival or other work, bands call from here. Many people get employment in a band party. Some people have bought jeeps by taking loans from banks for self-employment. Using in taxi and other works has started earning good monthly income.

Ansarbada's another remarkable step towards self-reliance is the formation of self-help groups by the Ghumantu Parishad for the development of settlements. 44 groups of liberated nomads are working, and three groups are also of men. These 44 savings groups have 1035300 Rupees collected in savings amount; Those who used to beg with outstretched hands have self-earned money with self-respect; Today many nomadic families like Ansarbada, Devgiri, West Maharashtra and Konkan are the main stream of society with savings of lakhs and cultured life.
