Deepotsav: The Light of Swadeshi Awareness and Sewa-Sanskriti

Diwali is not only a festival of lights but a moment when Bharat reawakens by drawing strength from its cultural memories. This year, Sewa Bharati units of Madhya Bharat, Haryana, Jaipur, Meerut, and Punjab celebrated Deepotsav as a practice of Swadeshi Chetna and Atmanirbharta, going beyond mere festivity.

Under the leadership of Vibhag Mantri Shri Rakesh Gupta Ji, Sewa Bharati Gurdaspur distributed relief material to flood-affected families across **11 villages** of the Dorangla area. Items distributed included **167 warm blankets, 25 dinner sets, 13 utensil sets, 13 cookers, 25 chapati boxes, 70 bedsheets, 15 tarpaulins, 100 rusk packets, and 85 pairs of clothing.** Events at Shamshepur and Dorangla benefitted over **70 families.** Sewa Bharati workers assured continued help to all affected families.

These achievements prove that sewa-based education fosters excellence not just academically but in sports, arts, and service.






Prant: Andhra Pradesh
