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## Two-Day Chhatrawas Volunteers Training Camp

A Two-Day Chhatrawas Volunteers Training Camp for the Eastern and Western Uttar Pradesh (Uttar Pradesh – Uttarakhand) regions was successfully organised on 13–14 December 2025 at the Indian Institute of Pulses Research, Kanpur.



The training session was guided by Shri Vijay Puranik ji, Joint General Secretary of Rashtriya Sewa Bharati; Shri Jaidev ji, Akhil Bharatiya Chhatrawas Pramukh; Shri Dhaniram ji, Kshetra Sewa Pramukh of Western Uttar Pradesh; Shri Yuddhveer ji, Kshetra Sewa Pramukh of Eastern Uttar Pradesh; and Shri Shriram ji, Prant Pracharak of Kanpur.

A total of 51 Volunteers from seven prants participated in the camp. Through discussion sessions and workshops, in-depth guidance was provided on subjects such as Chhatrawas management, the role of volunteers, organisational efficiency, and service effectiveness.



The objective of the camp was to enhance the Chhatrawas system, making it more robust, value-oriented, and effective. The training proved instrumental in strengthening the volunteers' vision, dedication, and organisational clarity.

Prant: Dakshin Bihar

Sewa Bharati organised a large medical check-up camp in the Rameshwar Upbhaag of Patna. Under the guidance of senior physician Dr Veena ji, residents received health check-ups, consultations, and lifestyle-related guidance. This camp was an effort to deliver healthcare facilities to those deprived of treatment due to economic constraints. With the support of Sewa Bharati volunteers, the event was successfully conducted and conveyed a message of health awareness in society.



Prant: Devgiri

On the occasion of the 100 years of Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh, Sewa Bharati Devgiri organised a one-day training workshop for teachers of Bal Sanskar and Kishori Vikas Vargas of the Dhule - Jalgaon Vibhag.

Guidance was provided on objectives, necessity, operational methods, and Sewa Basti outreach related to Bal Sanskar and Kishori Vikas.

More than 40 women from Jalgaon, Dhule, Nandurbar, and Pimpalner participated and resolved to start new vargas in their respective areas. The workshop proved to be a significant step toward organisational expansion, the awakening of women's power, and value formation in future generations.



Prant: Madhya Bharat

A seven-day vocational training program was initiated by Sewa Bharati at District Jail Rajgarh for the rehabilitation and self-reliance of prisoners. Under this program, prisoners are being provided practical training in electric jhalar making and motor winding.

The objective of the training is to empower prisoners with skills and inspire them toward a self-reliant life.



Prant: Punjab

Sewa Bharati Barnala administered Suvarnaprashan drops to 50 children in the age group of 1 day to 15 years. This initiative was significant in strengthening children's immunity, health, and values.

Prant: Uttar Bihar

At the Appan Pathshala operating in the Mukti Dham premises at Muzaffarpur, Uttar Bihar, the newly established computer education classroom was inaugurated by Shri A. Senthil Kumar ji, Akhil Bharatiya Sah-Sewa Pramukh of Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh. In the initial phase, two computers have been installed. Students of Classes 7–11 will receive daily training, while children of Classes 4–6 will be trained twice a week.



Prant: Jammu & Kashmir

Through the joint efforts of Sewa Bharati Jammu & Kashmir, National Medicos Organisation, and Ekal Abhiyan, the Maharshi Saptarishi Weekly Health Camp was organised at the Government High School in Kundabal (near Mansabal Lake), Kashmir. Health check-ups of 103 beneficiaries (men, women, and children) were conducted, and free medicines were distributed. A team of specialist doctors and medical students provided services.

This service initiative will now be organised every Sunday in remote and deprived areas of Kashmir, under which approximately 50 free health camps will be conducted annually. This initiative stands as a strong example of health, empathy, and service spirit.



Prant: Braj

A training camp for Presidents, Ministers, and Treasurers of 10 districts under the Bareilly Sambhag of Sewa Bharati Braj was conducted at the Sangh office Keshav Kripa in Bareilly. With the participation of 35 volunteers, guidance was provided on organisational functioning, sense of responsibility, and effective direction of service activities. The objective of the camp was to make Sewa Bharati units more empowered, coordinated, and socially useful, thereby strengthening the consciousness of sewa–Culture–organization in Braj Prant.



Prant: Malwa

Sewa Bharati distributed blankets and study material to 58 tribal boys residing in the hostel of the Janjati Sashaktikaran Kendra, Bada Ghosaliya, operated by Sewa Bharati.

Prant: Delhi

Sewa Bharati Delhi successfully organised a Navin Karyakarta Prashikshan Varg. A total of 23 newly assigned volunteers from Jhandewalan, Northern, Western, and Keshavpuram vibhags participated. Conducted in four sessions, the training began with a song and the Gayatri Mantra. The first session focused on organisational principles and volunteer formation. The second session provided clarity on the concept of service, coordination between the Sangh's Sewa Vibhag and Sewa Bharati, and upliftment-oriented service. The third session explained Sewa Bharati's geographical and organisational structure and the process of work planning. The final session addressed volunteers' questions through an interactive query-resolution format. The training proved to enhance vision, clarity, coordination, and confidence among volunteers. Participants expressed the need to organise such training periodically.



Prant: Uttarakhand

In Dehradun, a free health camp was organised at the Subhash Chandra Bose Paramarsh Chikitsalaya run by Sewa Bharati, providing consultation, examination, and guidance to citizens. At the same time, a sewing centre was inaugurated in the Gram Sabha Dhoolkot Mehre of Vikas Nagar, guiding women toward self-reliance through skill training along with values.



Prant: Meerut

A Kishori Vikas Kendra was inaugurated by Sewa Bharati at Shramik Kunj in Sector 122. At the centre, 67 adolescent girls are receiving training for mental, spiritual, and physical development. Through yoga and yasti practice, self-confidence, discipline, and a strong personality are being developed.



Prant: Malwa

A Kishori Vikas Ektrikaran was successfully conducted at Gautampura (Mhow). In this four-hour program, 139 girls from eight bastis participated. Through this gathering, the path was paved for starting 11 new Kishori Kendras.

Prant: Chittod

At Swami Vivekanand Vidya Niketan, Chhawani Kota, a three-day Prant Karyakarta Prashikshan Varg organised by Sewa Bharati provided in-depth guidance on organisational strengthening, service expansion, and dimensions of social transformation. The camp began with yoga, mantra recitation, and sadhana.

During the training, practical exercises were conducted on topics such as Bal Sanskar, Satsang, Hostels, Social Harmony, Organisational Operations, Pravas Yojana, Sewa Surabhi, Prachar-Vimarsh, and sense of responsibility.

The core message of the camp was clear: the goal of service is not to create dependence, but to make the last person in society capable, self-reliant, and a participant in nation-building.

At the conclusion, volunteers resolved with a service pledge to reach every corner of society.

Prant: Kerala

This training is a meaningful initiative toward enhancing youth employability and will prove beneficial to society in the long term.

The Women's District Unit of Akhil Bharatiya Agrawal Sangathan distributed warm clothes, shoes, and refreshments to approximately 45 children at the Bal Sanskar Kendras of Sewa Bharati Hanumangarh. Women office-bearers participated enthusiastically in this service activity.

Sewa Bharati Hanumangarh has been working continuously for the past 15 years for the education and value formation of needy children and the self-reliance of women. The children expressed happiness over the support, and the organisation reaffirmed its resolve to continue cooperation for children and women in the future.



Prant: Himachal

Giving shape to the spirit of Nar Sewa is Narayan Sewa, Sewa Bharati Kangra, through the Patient Assistance Centre operating at Tanda Medical College, is providing daily support to 60–70 needy patients and their families. This centre is not merely a facility, but a living symbol of compassion and empathy.

Under the leadership of District Secretary Smt. Suman Saini, dedicated teams of volunteers are

continuously engaged in service, fostering volunteerism, cooperation, and human values in society. In difficult times, this service becomes a source of mental and social support and guides youth in a positive direction. ## Kishori Vikas Kendra: From Fear to Fortitude

**Telangana Prant:** At Ameerpet Railway Junction in Hyderabad, a frightened fifteen-year-old girl clung to her mother's dupatta. The crowd saw her and moved on. There, Jayaprada Didi, Prant Secretary of Telangana Sewa Bharati, understood the silent pain. When the story of the inhuman atrocity inflicted upon the girl came to light, it was no longer just an incident-it became the collective reality of thousands of adolescent girls living in Sewa Bastis.



From here began the journey of a solution. It was decided that not sympathy, but security and empowerment were needed. Under the guidance of the then Kshetra Sewa Pramukh Patola Rama Reddy and Prant Sanghchalak Deshmukh ji, deliberations led to the concept of the Kishori Vikas Kendra. These centres are daily two-hour platforms where, along with education, training is provided in health awareness, self-defence, self-confidence, and self-reliance. Sewing-embroidery, vocational training, understanding of good-bad touch, and courage to face difficult situations-everything together.



Along with values, the feeling of patriotism is also awakened. These seemingly simple centres shape empowered women from within.

Girls emerging from these centres went on to start Taruni Vikas Kendras in bastis. During the COVID period, they rendered fearless service in ration distribution, medicines, and sanitisation. Sisters of the Matrimandal prevented child marriages in many places now, and many girls are also receiving IT training. Wherever these centres operated, change became visible. Mahatma Gandhi Nagar in Hyderabad, once plagued by addiction and gambling, is today on a new path. Youth gave up addictions, built sheds for the centres, and inspired the opening of 80 new centres. Operated with societal cooperation, these centres are transforming fear into fortitude and pain into change. This is the harbinger of a new dawn for India.
